

Exam Results at Mulberry School for Girls 2019

This is a summary of the last results students achieved in public examinations. These results are out of date. For the last two years teachers have awarded assessment grades. The results of these are published on our website.

GCSE Exam results 2019

Mulberry School for Girls is a non-selective school with a comprehensive intake. 195 students out of 207 (94.2%) were entered for the English Baccalaureate in 2019. This is significantly above the average for all schools in England of 40%. The average point score of pupils who entered the EBacc was 4.73 compared to an England average of 4.07.

Our Progress 8 Score for 2019 was +0.45 which is above average for schools in England. Our Attainment 8 score was 51.3. In schools in England the Attainment 8 score in 2019 was 46.7.

42% of students achieved 5 strong passes including maths and English. 27% of all grades awarded were 9–7. A number of our students did exceptionally well in terms of progress and attainment (see the table to the left: Students 1, 2 and 3 are three of the 837 students nationally to achieve seven grade 9s) 98% of pupils in Year 11 in 2019 were supported effectively to move on to appropriate sixth form provision that means that they stay and thrive. This is our published destinations figure. We are very proud of all of our girls for transitioning so successfully to their next steps.

Key Stage 5 Exam results 2019

Mulberry Sixth Form is an inclusive sixth form with A Level courses and applied learning courses. Pupils join our sixth form on a variety of pathways at Level 3 and Level 2.

Destinations and Pathways:

The percentage of students completing their main study programme with us at Mulberry School for Girls is 99.3% compared to an average in England of 91.3%. Our pupils remain with us to complete their courses.

87% of students in the whole cohort have secured university places across the country and 41 students (27%) having taken up places at Russell group universities.

Two students took up places at Oxbridge, with one reading Architecture and the other Maths.

A Level:

We are delighted to share some excellent student attainment at A Level (see table). In 2019 the overall progress of this year group was -0.29 (below average) with an average grade of a C, this is the same as the average grade for Tower Hamlets state schools and colleges. In England the average grade is a C+ nationally.

Applied Learning:

We run a Diploma in Health and Social Care at Level 3 and in 2019 20 pupils completed this pathway. The progress score for applied general courses was exactly 0 which represents average progress nationally. The average grade was Distinction compared to an average grade of Merit nationally.

90.9% of students on this pathway completed their main study programme. This is compared to 86.5% nationally.

Level 2 Qualifications:

A small number of students study Level 2 Health and Social Care with us while completing GCSE Maths and English. In 2019 the progress score for Maths (41 students) was +0.24 and for English (14 students) was exactly 0.
